



# Summer Internship: Teaching English with Amity Foundation Nanjing, China June - August, 2012

This summer the CPGC is offering four summer internship placements with the Amity Foundation in Nanjing, China. The Amity Foundation, an independent Chinese voluntary organization, was created in 1985 on the initiative of Chinese Christians to promote education, social services, health, and rural development from China's coastal provinces in the east to the minority areas of the west. Through the promotion of holistic development and public welfare, Amity serves society, benefits the people, and strives to promote world peace.

During the first five weeks, interns will teach English at the Amity Home of Blessings which runs a vocational program for individuals who are mentally disabled. Additionally, students will teach English to children of migrant workers. Amity has been running a project for the children of migrant workers since 2000. Recently, they have introduced volunteers from overseas to these schools in order to teach English and/or participate in English camps.

The second four weeks (from July 9-August 6, 2012) will be spent with the Amity Summer English Program teaching English to middle school teachers in the surrounding areas of Nanjing. Interns will participate in a three day training with the other Amity volunteers before they are introduced to their placement site around Nanjing.

- **At least one year of college Chinese language is *required* for this internship**
