



Research, Write, and Organize for Environmental Sustainability in Northern Michigan!

The Michigan Land Use Institute, located in the beautiful, hip northern Lake Michigan town of Traverse City, is seeking up to three summer interns for work in our various programs. Interns will be given assignments based on their skills, interests and needs of the organization.

The Institute, advocates for--and communicates via its Web site about--local food and farming; transit, walkable communities, and regional planning; and clean energy.

Selected interns will discover, communicate with, evaluate, and assemble a list of non-profits whose own best practices can inform our project. Our intern will also report and write news features about people or companies who have taken similar steps and describe their success and challenges. The intern may also become involved in some of the community outreach that the project will depend on for its success.

The intern placed in the **energy and environment program** will be focused communicating the economic and environmental benefits to energy efficiency. The intern placed in our **sustainable agriculture program** will help distribute our local food and farming guide, and support the programs goal of increasing local food production and consumption in northwest Michigan. The intern placed in our **urban planning program** will support the efforts of a car free community and expanding the regional transit system in the area.

Ideal Candidates: We need real self-starters who understand and care about changing the world with strong communications and through advocacy and community organizing. You should be good at online research, using persistent email and phone contact to track down details, keeping large amounts of disparate information in well-organized archives, writing clearly and very accurately, and making professional contacts with people from many different walks of life.

This is a 10-week internship. The intern will provide their own computer. MLUI will provide housing within walking or biking distance of work, office space, and staff guidance. CPGC covers Haverford's intern's costs, including travel, local transportation, food, and summer earnings expectation for students who receive financial aid.
