



Center for Peace & Global Citizenship Sponsored Internships with Philadelphia Futures

Philadelphia Futures' mission is to prepare "students from low-income families to enter and succeed in college by providing mentoring, academic enrichment, college guidance, and financial incentives. Working with volunteer mentors, donors, and school and college personnel in direct service to students, in partnership with educational institutions, and in advocacy activities in the broader community, Philadelphia Futures increases the percentage of Philadelphia graduates prepared for higher education, while simultaneously reducing the institutional barriers to their academic success."

Sponsor-A-Scholar (SAS), a cornerstone of the organization, "serves students attending Philadelphia's neighborhood high schools. This nationally-acclaimed program provides a comprehensive array of services and resources to students and their families to remove the academic, financial, and social barriers that traditionally prevent low-income, first-generation-to-college students from achieving college success."

The work: Interns are needed to work as instructional support for one of the many of the summer programs taking place on various college campuses (Drexel, Temple, Eastern) in the Philadelphia area. You will be working alongside dedicated professionals and award winning professors. Interns will lead small group work, provide one on one technical and writing support, will be expected to promote a positive learning environment for the students participating in the program. One on one work with individual students, as well as administrative support in the center city Philadelphia office will be available for the remainder of each work day after the program ends for the day. Interns will also help with coordination of the College Marathon hosted by Haverford College.

Internships can range from part-time 4 week placements to full-time 8-10 week internships (at the availability of the selected interns and the agreement of the Philadelphia Futures staff).

Interns will participate in CPGC's orientation weekend April 14-15, 2012, and complete related coursework their return to campus.

The stipend: CPGC covers Haverford's intern's costs, including housing, travel, local transportation, food and summer earnings expectation (pro-rated by length of internship) for students who receive financial aid. Interns will be strongly encouraged to live in Philadelphia.
