The Fords vs. Muhlenberg

Scouting the Mules: In a rematch of last year's conference championship game, freshman **Alexandra Chili** shot 5-of-8 from three-point range and scored 19 points as Muhlenberg came from 10 points down to defeat Gettysburg, 72-63 a week ago. The victory improved the Mules to 3-0 on the young season ... **Ron Rohn** is in his eighth season as head coach and has a record of 140-51. Last season, Rohn guided Muhlenberg to its second conference title in his tenure ... The Mules were the preseason favorite to win the conference and are led by senior All-American **Lauren Boyle's** 18.0 points

per-game. Boyle is a two-time first-team All-CC selection, she entered her senior season third on the Mules' all-time scoring list

Last time they met: The Mules swept the season series from Haverford in 2007-08. Muhlenberg won the first meeting, 78-63, and the second game, 72-40, on their home court.

Series record: Muhlenberg leads, 43-1.

Haverford's last win: Jan. 31, 1991, 51-44, at Alumni Field House.

Last Time Out

LANCASTER, Pa. - After falling behind by 15 points in the opening half, visiting Haverford College out scored Franklin & Marshall in second half action but couldn't catch the Diplomats by the final buzzer, falling to their hosts 51-40 in the Centennial Conference opener for both schools.

Shooting just 11 percent from the field over the opening 20 minutes, Haverford dug themselves a big hole as F&M shot out of the gate with a 28-13 lead by the intermission, contrasting the Fords' cold half with a 42 percent stanza of their own.

The Diplomats stretched their margin to 33-13 in the opening minutes of the second half before Haverford's Danielle Harrison sparked a 10-0 run that cut the lead in half.

Harrison popped a 3-pointer to kick off the rally, then teammate Allie Lieberman hit a jumper that cut the lead to 15.

Following a rebound by Kathleen Abels, Harrison hit again from behind the arc after which Lieberman picked up a steal to put the ball back in the Fords' hands.

Harrison hit again, this time for only a 2, but the safe lead F&M thought they held had disappeared in just over two minutes.

Haverford could get no closer than nine over the remaining 14 minutes, though, as F&M was able to trade points with the Fords the rest of the way.

Harrison had a team-high 18 points and three steals for Haverford in their losing efforts, and Abels also reached double-digits for the night with 10 points. Brittany Lattisaw pulled down nine rebounds to pace the Fords on the boards.

F&M was led by Sarah Meisenberg's 19 points and four assists. Cara Landolfi chipped in with 10 points and a game-leading 12 rebounds.

For the night Haverford shot 21 percent from the field but hit three times as many shots from the floor in the second half than they did in the opening half.

Defensively Haverford cooled off F&M's opening to the game by limiting the Diplomats to just 23 percent shooting in the final 20 minutes.
