Haverford College Women's Basketball

The Fords vs. Swarthmore College

Last time out: The Fords could not rebound from a slow start en route to a 62-38 loss to Gettysburg on Saturday afternoon. Haverford committed 14 turnovers and shot just 24 percent from the field in the opening stanza. For the game HC turned the ball over 27 times and it lead to 24 Bullets points. A **Kathleen Abels** three-pointer at 7:29 in the first half made it a seven-point game, but Gettysburg finished the half on an 18-2 run to take a 37-14 lead into the break. **Natalie Richman** had a team-high 10 points for Haverford and also grabbed six boards. **Brittany Lattisaw** was held to five points on the day, but still had a game-high 10 rebounds.

Playing the percentages: Lattisaw's 15.8 and Abels 13.1 points per game account for 56 percent of the Fords' scoring.

Doubling up: Lattisaw is one of three players in the conference averaging a double-double this season. The leader in both categories is Swarthmore's Kathryn Stockbrower who is averaging 18.5 PPG and 14.6 RPG. This should create an interesting matchup between the two forwards.

Behind enemy lines: Assistant coach **Karen Berk** is a 2008 graduate of Swarthmore. She scored 1,454 career points and is the school's leader in blocked shots with 108.
