# Haverford College Women's Basketball

## The Fords vs. Ursinus College

**Last time out:** The Fords held a one-point lead with 8:36 left in the game, but saw it slip away as they fell to No. 25 Muhlenberg on Tuesday. Haverford received 41 points from three players, two of whom recorded double-doubles, but it was not enough. **Brittany Lattisaw** scored 18 points and had 15 rebounds, while **Natalie Richman** tallied 10 points and ripped 12 boards. **Kathleen Abels** was the Fords second leading scorer with 13. In the second half HC continued to answer every time the Mules scored and in a span of five minutes the Fords regained the lead four times. However, the last came on a **Sara Cram** jumper and it proved to be Haverford's last lead of the

game. Muhlenberg scored the next seven points to take a 46-40 advantage and continued that run to 13-2.

**Tough D:** The Fords have held their last five opponents under 60 points for the first time since Feb., 2001.

**Scoring tandem:** Haverford is only one of three schools in the conference that has two of the top-14 scoring leaders in the conference. **Lattisaw** is second at 16.0 points per game, while **Abels** is 14th at a 12.5 PPG. Washington and Muhlenberg are the only other schools with two scorers in that group.

The Bears are led by **Jaclyn Hilf**'s 10.5 PPG.

**Last time they met:** The Bears swept the season series last year with an 80-41 victory at Helfferich Hall on Feb. 20, 2008.
