The Fords at Washington College

Last time out: Haverford swept the season series from Bryn Mawr with a 45-28 victory at Schwartz Gymnasium on Tuesday. Haverford built a 21-point halftime lead thanks to pressure defense, hot shooting and a 13-2 run midway through the half. The Owls committed 14 turnovers, while the Fords made nine steals. HC shot better than 45 percent from the field and was led by **Kathleen Abels** who was 4-for-7 from the field and made both of her three-point attempts for 10 first half points. The Fords started the second half by scoring the first seven points. Jumpers by **Brittany Lattisaw** and **Elizabeth Mayell** and a fast break lay up by **Sara Cram** fueled HC's onslaught. The Owls were

held scoreless for the opening 5:30 of the half until a **Jessica Allen** free throw got them on the board. The 28 points allowed by Haverford is the fewest they surrendered in a game since holding Bryn Mawr to 33 points on Feb. 2, 2005. **Abels** led the Fords with 12 points while **Cram** chipped in with 10.

In their last meeting: Haverford used used an 18-3 second half run that spanned five minutes down the stretch to defeat visiting Washington, 69-64, nine days ago. An **Alejandra Alvarez** three-pointer with 5:12 remaining put the Fords ahead for good.
