Sententiae Antīquae

5. Graecia capta asperum victōrem cēpit. (Horace.—**victor**, **-tōris**, here = Rome.)

6. Atticus Cicerōnī ex patriā fugientī multam pecūniam dedit. (Nepos.—**Atticus**, a friend of Cicero.)

7. Sī mihi eum ēducandum committēs, studia eius fōrmāre ab īnfantiā incipiam.
(Quintilian.—**formare**.—**infantia, -ae**.)
8. Saepe stilum verte, bonum libellum scriptūrus . (Horace.—**stilum vertere**, to invert the *stilus* = to use the eraser.)
9. Cūrā orātōris dictūrī eōs audītūrōs dēlectat. (Quintilian.)
10. Mortī Sōcratis semper illacrimō, legēns Platōnem. (Cicero.—**Sōcrates, -cratis**.—**illacrimare**, to weep over + dat. (as often with compound verbs)—**Platō, -tōnis**.)
11. Memoria vītae bene āctae multōrumque bene factōrum iūcunda est. (Cicero.)
12. Quī timēns vīvet, līber nōn erit umquam. (Horace.—**quī**, as often, = **is quī**.)
14. Verbum semel ēmissum volat irrevocābile . (Horace.—**semel**, adv., *Once*—**ē-mittere**.—**volāre**, to fly.—**irrevocābilis, -e**.)
