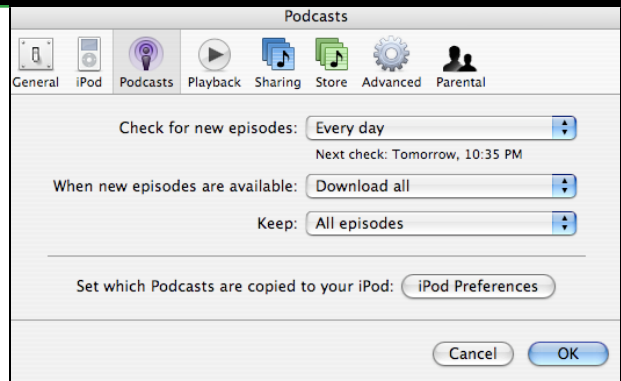


SUBSCRIBING AND USING PODCASTS [MAC]

Podcasts can be downloaded and listened to via iTunes, which is available as a free download at: www.itunes.com.

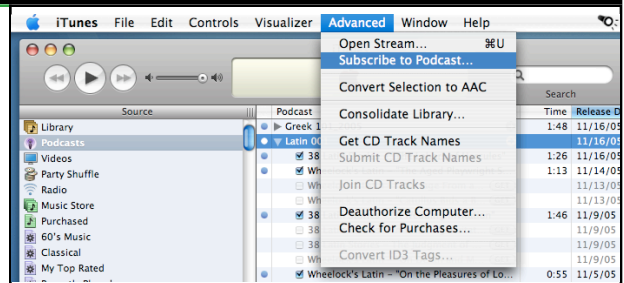
Set Podcast Preferences

1. Open iTunes (you must have version 5 or later).
2. In the "iTunes" menus in the Menu bar, select "Preferences..."
3. Click on the "Podcasts" button.
4. Set "When new episodes are available" to "Download all".
5. Set "Keep" to "All episodes".
6. Click "OK".

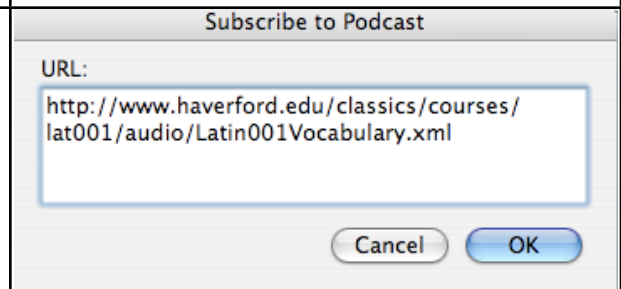


Subscribe to Podcast....

1. Click on "Advanced" Menu and select "Subscribe to Podcast".

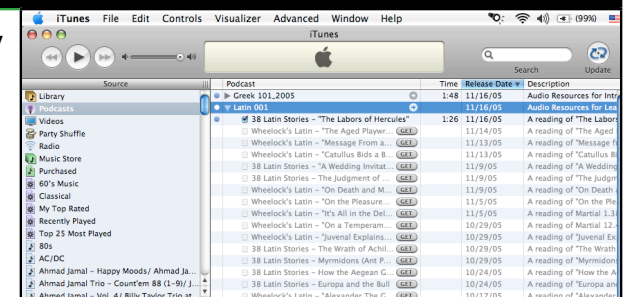


1. In the pop-up "Subscribe to Podcast" window enter the address for the RSS feed.
2. Click on "Advanced" Menu and select "Subscribe to Podcast"
3. In pop-up window, enter the URL of the .xml feed.



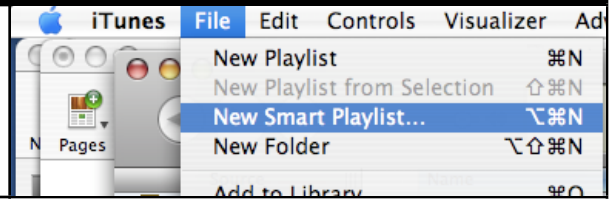
Download Previous Episodes

1. In the Playlist Window (on the left of window, headed by "Library"), click on "Podcasts".
2. Click on wedge next to name of Podcast to see all files.
3. Click "Get" next to any files that did not download automatically (you should need to do this only once).

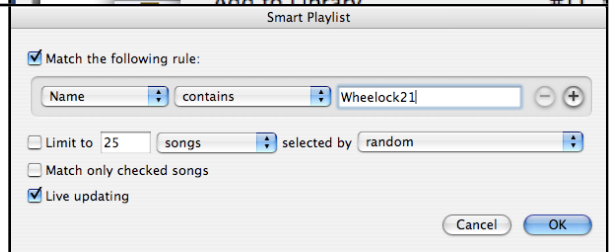


Creating Smart Playlists

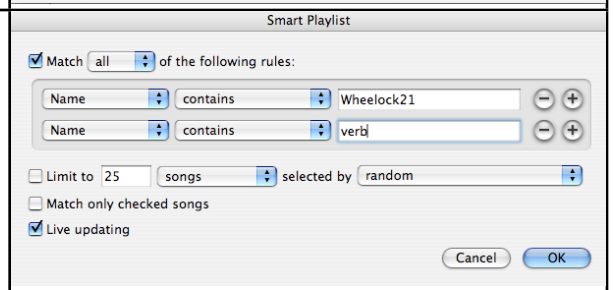
1. In the “File” menu in the Menu Bar, select “New Smart Playlist...”



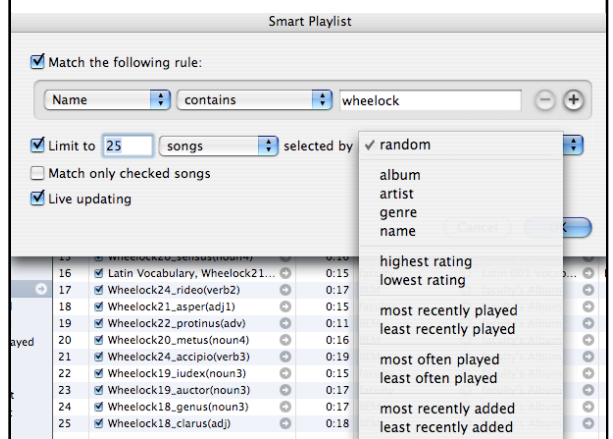
1. In the “Smart Playlist” window, set the “Name” to contain the desired attribute (a chapter, a part of speech, a particular declension or conjugation).
2. Be sure that the “Live updating” check-box is selected.



1. You can further restrict or expand the vocabulary included in the playlist by clicking the “+” button on the right side of the window.
2. Add another chapter to include two chapters, add another part of speech (e.g. nouns and adjectives), etc.
3. You can add as many additional attributes as you like from the following list:
 - a) **noun, verb, adj** — you can specify the declension or conjugation, or each (e.g. noun1, noun4, verb3; N.B. only third declension adjectives are marked (adj3), first/second are listed simply as adj.
 - b) **adv, conj, prep, pronoun**



4. When using multiple attributes, you may “Match all”, which find only vocabulary with all attributes; “Match any” will find any file that has any of the attributes.
5. You can also create random lists, or lists of the least practiced vocabulary by using the “Limit to x Songs” checkbox, with with or without other limiting attributes.



Using Playlists to Practice Vocabulary

1. Once you have made a playlist, it will appear in the Playlist window.
2. Double-click on any word to begin practice vocabulary in that playlist.
3. You can randomize the playlist by click on the “Shuffle” button located at the bottom of the iTunes window (below the Playlist window). You can create a new order by double-clicking on the same button.
