ABSTRACT

The collection relates primarily to William Huntington (1907–1990), a 20th-century Quaker peace activist and the ship *The Golden Rule* which Huntington and others used to protest atomic testing in the South Pacific. Included are correspondence, photographs, conference papers, newspaper articles, memoranda, and minutes.

BIOGRAPHICAL NOTE

William Reed Huntington (1907–1990) was an American architect, pacifist and Quaker representative and director of the Quaker program at the United Nations (QUNP). He was active in the American Friends Service Committee as well.

Huntington was a crew member of "*The Golden Rule*," a small boat that sailed into the South Pacific in 1958 to protest atomic testing there by the United States. Huntington and the other crew members of the *Golden Rule*, James Peck, George Willoughby, Orion Sherwood and skipper Albert Bigelow were and sentenced to 60 days in jail.

In World War II, Huntington was co-director of a camp for Conscientious Objectors at Big Flats, N.Y. After the war, he was co-commissioner of relief operations in Europe for the American Friends Service Committee from 1947 to 1949.

From 1961 to 1963, he was director of refugee assistance operations in Tunisia and Algeria in connection with the French-Algerian War.

SCOPE AND CONTENTS OF THE COLLECTION

The collection relates primarily to William Huntington (1907–1990), a 20th-century Quaker peace activist and the ship *The Golden Rule* which Huntington and others used to protest atomic testing in the South Pacific at the end of the 1950s. Included are correspondence, photographs, conference papers, newspaper articles, memoranda, and minutes. Other important subjects are Civilian Public Service Camps, specifically Big Flats, Conscientious Objection, the Quaker United Nations Program, American Friends Service Committee (AFSC). Letter writers include Willy Brandt, Chancellor of West Germany, 1969–1974, AFSC members Stephen Cary, Julia Branson and Louis Schneider and U.S. Presidents Dwight Eisenhower and Jimmy Carter.
