**SCOPE AND CONTENTS OF THE COLLECTION**

Collection contains letters, memorials, commonplace books, miscellaneous items of the Pike family, especially Sarah Pike and letters of **Thomas Scattergood** to his son, Alfred **Scattergood**.

**DETAILED DESCRIPTION OF THE COLLECTION**

1. Rules of Discipline, Philadelphia, 1806, containing ms. extracts of minutes of the Y.M., 1806, 1812, 1813, 1815, 1816, 1818, 1824, 1829. 15 p., in 2 hands.
2. Memorials of Thomas Pleasants, Mary Bonsall, Isaac Sharpless (1780), Elizabeth Drinker (wife of Daniel Drinker), Sarah Shoemaker, Caleb Hoskins et al.
3. Copy work by Rebecca Scattergood; also by Pike family members.
4. Letters & poems by Stephen Pike (3 items)
5. Précis of Y.M. events, 1836, Hicksite, written by W.I. A[llinson].

6. Rental receipt written by John Cox, N.Y., 1818

7. Commonplace books of Sarah Pike.

8. Letters of Thomas Scattergood to his son, Alfred, in 1900, while traveling in the west, e.g. 7 mo 27 1900, from Alaska [describes the Indians as "a short, heavy set, large featured, ugly looking people who look to be and probably are stupid tho said to be sharp at bargaining"]; and to S[amuel?] Allen in 1901 & 1902, e.g. 6 mo 26 1902, La Jolla [Philadelphia Quakerism is not adapted to Cal. Y.M. - they do not seem to need silent worship or understanding of the Divine Message]. Ca. 20 items.
