ABSTRACT

Subjects depicted on the glass lantern slides are Haverford College, portraits of Quakers, views of Barbados and Quaker sites in the West Indies.

BIOGRAPHICAL NOTE

William Lloyd Baily (1861-) was a member of the Haverford College class of 1883. He was involved in many activities as an undergraduate and became permanent class secretary. He later studied and became professor of architecture and the University of Pennsylvania and as architect of the firm Baily and Bassett was commissioned to design several buildings on Haverford's campus and elsewhere.

Henry J. Cadbury (1883-1974) was a member of the Haverford College class of 1903. He was Phi Beta Kappa and editor-in chief of *The Haverfordian*. He received his Ph.D. from Harvard University and was a professor of Greek and Biblical Literature at Haverford, later taught at Andover Theological Seminary, and Bryn Mawr College. He was an

immensely prolific author and a founder of the American Friends Service Committee and Nobel Prize winner on behalf of AFSC.
