The William E. and Charlotte M. Cadbury House offers space for 13 students in two doubles, #26 and #34, and nine singles, #'s 22, 23, 24, 25, 27, 28, 31, 32 and 33.

Cadbury House offers a quiet study/substance-free environment. Students who either choose or are assigned to Cadbury House agree to neither possess nor use alcohol on the premises and to help maintain a quiet and sober study atmosphere. Interested students are encouraged to talk with this year's residents about the pros and cons of living in this type of environment. If all of the spaces are not taken in advance, leftover singles or doubles will be offered in Round IV. Students who draw into Cadbury House housing do so with the same commitment as those who applied initially. If a student living in Cadbury House is found to be in violation of the spirit of this housing, that student will have to move out as soon as space becomes available.

A faculty member lives in the first floor faculty apartment. Some points to keep in mind:

- Due to the lack of sound proofing, residents are expected to keep music and noise in general to modest levels both while in the apartment and in their comings and goings on the stairs.
- Residents are expected to be responsible for the behavior of their guests.

Students who feel they *need a substance-free or a quiet environment* for health reasons will be given first priority. Students who *prefer a substance-free* environment will be given second priority. Students who want to live on the floor *primarily because of the quiet study* atmosphere will be given third priority.

Applications will be accepted only from individuals, but applicants may express a roommate preference for the two doubles. (Both applicants must match regarding preference.)

Students who apply to live in Cadbury House are expected to live there if they are selected.

While not required, personal statements, letters of support from your dean, staff members of CAPS (the Counseling and Psychological Services staff), the Health Services, or students who know you well, are *highly* recommended to be included with your application. You are also welcome to speak with Marianne (Smitty) Smith, Director of Residential Life. Applications, supporting materials, and conversations are kept strictly confidential. Supporting materials are *not required* but help the Director establish priorities fairly based on the information provided. Please note, if you choose to submit supporting materials, updated materials need to be submitted each year you apply.

The Director of Residential Life will prioritize the applications based on the information provided and assign lottery numbers. On Wednesday, March 21, around 12:00 pm (noon), lottery numbers will be sent out via email to all applicants along with a link to the online Room Preference Form. Applicants are asked to please fill out and submit this form by 12:00pm (noon) on Thursday, March 22. Room assignments will then be made and sent out to all applicants by 6:00pm, Thursday, March 22.
