

Andrew Silk Summer Journalism Internship

A Haverford or Bryn Mawr College student entering their sophomore, junior or senior year interested in the field of journalism is eligible for a stipend toward a summer internship in print or broadcast journalism. The student needs to obtain a summer position in print or broadcast journalism.

Students should submit the [Online Application Form](#) where you will be asked to upload an application letter/essay containing information about the internship they plan to complete in the summer of 2020 and biographical background, resume, unofficial transcript and two writing samples by **Monday, March 16, 2020.**

History

This summer will mark the 37th year that a bi-college student will have the opportunity to receive training with a professional news organization with the help of the Silk Memorial Fund.

Andrew Silk was a 1976 Haverford alumnus and a former editor of the *News*, who died of cancer in December 1981. During his journalism career, Andrew had worked for *Greenwich Time* in Greenwich, Connecticut and the *Virginian-Pilot Ledger Star* in Richmond, Virginia. In Andrew's memory, his parents, Bernice and Leonard Silk, established summer internships for Haverford and Bryn Mawr students at those papers.

Now, the program provides a stipend for a student who has obtained a summer position with a news organization in the location of their choice.
