## A CPGC Summer Partnership

*Creating community through the power of art*

Asian Arts Initiative is a community-based arts center in Philadelphia that engages artists and everyday people to create art that explores the diverse experiences of Asian Americans, addresses our social context, and imagines and effects positive community change. Asian Arts Initiative is seeking dynamic, self-starters to engage in an excellent opportunity to experience various aspects of public arts programming, development and marketing while working for a well-known community based nonprofit organization. The selected interns will work directly with Programming, Development and Communications department, and additional staff.

Interns may assist the Asian Arts Initiative in both programming and development activities, including but not limited to:

- coordinating a range of activities and artists projects that are part of Pearl Street Project
- day-to-day responsibilities related to our neighborhood-focused artist residencies
- community and fundraising events and community outreach
- grant research
- collaborating with Development and Communications staff on new ideas, directions, and venues for organization development, marketing and communications.
- coordination of development related special initiatives, such as Young Friends Program or Alumni Program.

**CPGC's Internship Program:** includes a social justice retreat (April 7-9) and enrollment in a course upon students' return to campus. The student may take one of two courses designed for interns, or propose an alternate course more suitable to the themes of the internship.

**Stipend:** CPGC funds a 10-week internship, including travel, lodging (at HCA or in Philadelphia) local transportation, food, and the summer earnings expectation for students who receive financial aid.

**Eligibility and Application Information:** This internship open to Haverford sophomores and juniors (freshmen with experience will also be considered). Applicants must submit an application form, a cover letter, your transcript (unofficial is fine), and a recommendation form completed by a faculty member. Apply through [CPGC's web site](#).

**Deadline:** All application materials are due by **February 5, 2017**. The application process includes an interview at Asian Arts Initiative the week of February 20-24, 2017.
