Asian Arts Initiative (AAI) is a community-based arts center in Philadelphia's Chinatown North neighborhood that engages artists and community members to create art that explores the diverse experiences of Asian Americans, addresses their socio-historical context, and imagines and effects positive community change. AAI is seeking dynamic self-starters to engage with various aspects of public arts programming. The selected interns will work directly with Programming, Development and Communications, and other AAI staff members.

CPGC, Hurford Center for the Arts and Humanities, and AAI co-sponsor summer internships as part of a year-long fellowship program (more info below and on CPGC's website).

Summer 2020 Internship Description (To be confirmed)

- Coordinate a range of activities and artists' projects that are part of the Initiative's summer events, including preparing gallery exhibitions
- Day-to-day responsibilities related to AAI's neighborhood-focused artist residencies
- Community and fundraising events, community outreach, and grant research
- Collaborate with Development and Communications staff around development, marketing, and communications
- Coordinate development-related special initiatives, such as the Young Friends Program

Application Information: Interested applicants must meet with the Domestic Fellowship Advisor, [Ryan Rose](#). This internship is open to Haverford sophomores and juniors (first-years with experience will also be considered). Applicants must submit an application form, a cover letter, a transcript (unofficial is fine), and a recommendation form completed by a faculty member. Apply through the CPGC's [website](#).

CPGC's Fellowships for Global Citizenship Program: This summer internship is part of a larger fellowship that offers a comprehensive preparatory and re-entry program along with funding and support during your summer engagement with Asian Arts Initiative. Prior to the summer internship, CPGC staff, faculty and community partners will help students build on their passions and capacities for ethical engagement and social change action. Fellows continue their journey through a re-entry course upon returning to campus in the fall. Pre-internship Programming

- All Philadelphia area fellows will attend a dynamic week of activities during the week of May 18-22, 2020 (based on campus with daily trips into Philadelphia).
- The 2020 CPGC Fellow cohort will meet on or near campus for a retreat, and engage in other preparatory activities during the spring semester that will be relevant to their fellowships.

Stipend: This internship lasts 10 weeks, and the CPGC provides a stipend for travel, lodging (at HCA or in Philadelphia), local transportation, food, and the summer earnings expectation for students who receive financial aid.

Deadline: All application materials are due by **February 2, 2020**. The application process includes an interview at Asian Arts Initiative in February (date TBC).
