

# The Center for Peace & Global Citizenship Fellowship with



Philadelphia Futures is a nonprofit organization that provides Philadelphia's low-income, first-generation-to-college students with the tools, resources and opportunities necessary for admission to and success in college. The organization transforms lives by breaking down the barriers that have historically excluded this population of students from achieving college success. The students Philadelphia Futures serves are provided with a comprehensive, time-tested array of programs designed to reduce the institutional, academic, social and financial barriers to being successful in college.

Through its two direct service programs, Sponsor-A-Scholar (SAS) and College Connection, Philadelphia Futures annually serves nearly 600 high school and college students with academic enrichment services, personalized college guidance, placement and retention services and financial resources. Unique in their depth and duration, these intensive, individualized programs support students from high school through college completion.

## Summer 2020 Internship Description

- Providing instructional support for summer programs happening on various college campuses (Drexel, Temple University, and Eastern University).
- Working alongside dedicated professionals and award-winning professors to lead small group work, provide one-on-one technical and writing support, and promote a positive learning environment for students enrolled in the program.
- Working one-on-one with individual students.
- Providing administrative support in the Center City Philadelphia office.
- Supporting coordination of the College Admissions Marathon hosted by Haverford in June.

**Application Information:** This internship is open to Haverford first-years, sophomores and juniors. It is strongly recommended that applicants have background experience that low-income, first-generation high school students can relate to. Interested applicants must meet with the Domestic Fellowship Advisor, Ryan Rose. Applicants must submit an application

form, a cover letter, a transcript (an unofficial is fine), and a recommendation form completed by a faculty member. Applications are done through the [CPGC's website](#).

**CPGC's Fellowships for Global Citizenship Program:** This summer internship is part of a larger fellowship that offers a comprehensive preparatory and re-entry program along with funding and support during your summer engagement with Philadelphia Futures. Prior to the summer internship, CPGC staff, faculty and community partners will help students build on their passions and capacities for ethical engagement and social change action. Fellows continue their journey through a re-entry course upon returning to campus in the fall. ### Pre-internship Programming

- The 2020 CPGC Fellow cohort will meet on or near campus for a half-day retreat, and engage in other preparatory activities during the spring semester that will be relevant to their fellowships.
- All Philadelphia-area fellows will attend a dynamic orientation week of activities during the week directly following the end of the spring semester (based on campus with daily trips to Philadelphia).

**Stipend:** The CPGC funds a 10-week internship, including travel, lodging (at HCA or in Philadelphia) local transportation, food, and the summer earnings expectation for students who receive financial aid.

**Deadline:** All application materials are due by **February 2nd, 2020**. The application process includes an interview at Philadelphia Futures in February.
