Moving Forward regarding Travel Medicine Visits

Because they are not considered either "medically necessary" or "preventive care", travel medicine visits are generally not covered by insurance. In light of that, Health Services will not charge for associated office visits or administration fees.

Your practitioner may recommend a vaccination (please check the www.cdc.gov/travel website); if so, you will have to pay those costs:

Hepatitis A: \$96.00

Typhoid (injection): \$70.00

Oral Typhoid is a prescription sent to either CVS or Merricks's. Its cost will depend on your individual health insurance plan. You can call the pharmacy first and ask what the cost will be; as of this post, those costs are:

Oral typhoid at CVS: \$93.89

Oral typhoid at Merricks: \$95.00

Depending on where you are traveling, you may need a prescription for malaria. You can call the pharmacy BEFORE you pick up your prescription to find out the cost. We strongly recommend the "Good Rx App" for cost savings.
