Haverford College — Rutgers University-Robert Wood Johnson Medical School Academic Clinical Experience Summer (ACES) Program 2024

The ACES Program at Rutgers University-Robert Wood Johnson Medical School (RWJMS) is a six-week summer program for Tri-Co and Princeton sophomores seriously considering a career in medicine. RWJMS will provide academic enrichment and clinical experiences, faculty and clinician mentoring, and interaction with medical students.

Program Details

- 6-week summer program running June July 2024 (tentatively June 3 July 12), including:
 - An anatomy/physiology enrichment opportunity
 - Practice of medicine seminars
 - o One-on-one clinical mentorship with an RWJMS physician
 - Medical school application guidance, and much more!
- Campus housing at Rutgers and a meal allowance
 - NJ residents receive a stipend to cover food and transportation

ACES Program Eligibility

- Sophomore (Class of 2026) at Haverford College
- Realistic plan for completion of RWJMS prerequisite courses by graduation
- Minimum 3.0 cumulative GPA at time of application, with minimum 3.2 cumulative GPA at time of graduation
- Minimum combined SAT verbal/math score of 1300 or ACT score of 29
 - Those who have not taken the SAT or ACT would be considered. If they progress for consideration for medical school however, they must take the MCAT.
- US citizen or permanent resident status
- Considered socioeconomically and/or educationally disadvantaged as measured by one of the following criteria:

• Socioeconomic disadvantage

- Family income on the most recent tax return is 400% or less than the 2022 US Department of Health and Human Services poverty level guidelines for your family size. This aligns with the <u>AAMC Fee Assistance program</u> requirements for medical school applicants or
- You and your family receive need-based aid (e.g., Pell grants, Haverford grant aid) or
- Personal/family financial contributions to attend Haverford are less than 30% of the cost of attendance.

• Educational disadvantage

- None of your parents/guardians has obtained a post-secondary degree (associate degree or higher) or
- Fewer than 50% of graduates from your high school attended a two- or four-year college.

ACES Program Expectations

- Participants should be intellectually curious, outgoing, and genuinely enthusiastic about the chance to expand their knowledge of science and medicine.
- Participants may not take classes during the ACES summer program; full-time participation is expected.
- Participants may be asked to assist in peer mentoring and recruitment of future ACES Fellows.

ACES Program Application Process

All applicants must submit the following to Todd Rothman, Director of Pre-Professional Advising:

- Completed Haverford ACES Application Form
- Short Essays (maximum 750 words each) in a separate document
- Updated Resume, including:
 - Intended major(s) and minor(s) at Haverford
 - Significant high school and college activities (e.g., leadership, community service, extracurricular and summer activities, research experience, clinical exposure)
- Unofficial transcripts from any college(s) you have attended
- One letter of recommendation
 - From a Haverford professor or research supervisor who knows you well and can speak to your academic abilities and readiness for a career in medicine.
 - You may submit one optional additional letter of recommendation, if you believe it will be helpful to your candidacy
