

AREAS OF CONCENTRATION

Areas of concentration afford students a formal opportunity to pursue an area of study distinct from, but relevant to, their choice of major. An area of concentration is elected at the time a student declares a major. To fulfill an area of concentration, a student must normally complete six course credits selected with the aid of an informal faculty committee for that concentration, drawn from at least two departments of the College. Of the six course credits, no fewer than two and no more than three of them will also form part of the student's major. In this respect, concentrations differ from the traditional minor, which is conducted entirely within one single department other than the student's major department, and which may be wholly unrelated to that department.
